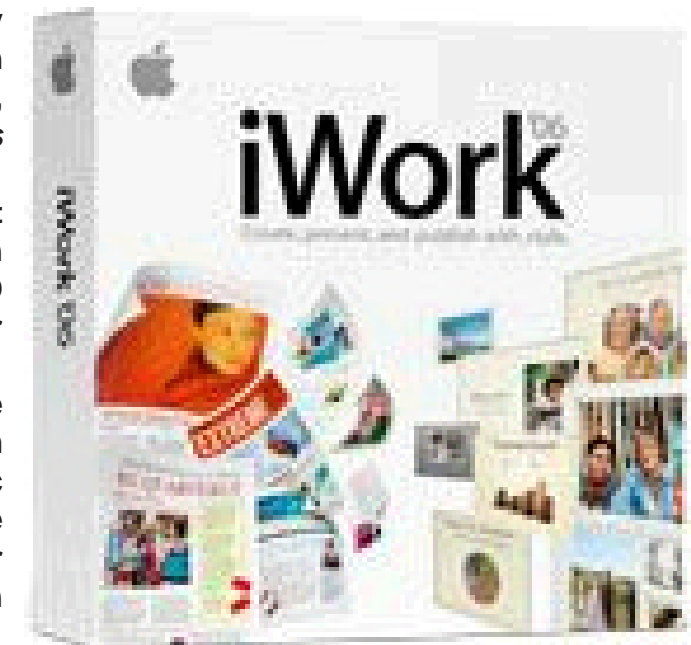

Apple Updated QuickTime to version 7.2b, adding full screen viewing to the free version of the QuickTime Player application. The new version also updated the H.264 codec, fixed several bugs, and addressed several security issues.

Burn it again, Sam

BurnAgain DVD 1.2 supports multiple burns to DVD-RW media. It's the only app on the Mac that allows the user add files to a CD-R, CD-RW or DVD-RW several times, without creating multiple volumes. It allows the user to change the title of the disk at each burn, hiding of previously burned sessions and preserves all HFS specific attributes (resource forks). BurnAgain DVD supports the use of Aliases and Tigers "Burnable Folders". It requires OS X 10.3 or later for CD burning, OS X 10.4 or later for DVD-RW burning. It is a Universal Application and is "Leopard Ready." A single user license is priced at US\$22.80
