Looking ahead, Steve Jobs expects to offer new operating system versions every 12 to 18 months using Mac OS 10.5 Leopard as the foundation. So while some of us might wait till our Panther or Tiger breaks a leg, sooner or later we'll be staring at uncaging, or un-boxing, Leopard. With the new products cycles and thus news historically at rest till after the holidays, we focus this edition on the latest version of the OS – which Slate magazine says, “demolishes Vista... Apple underpromises

and overdelivers while Vista's technical improvements remain difficult for users to appreciate and utilize.”
